A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As I sit at my desk crafting this report, I do so with a bit of a heavy heart. I am so proud of the work that is done at the Assaulted Women's Helpline (AWHL), so impressed with the team that ensures that every caller has a listening and supportive voice on the other side of the phone, so privileged to have worked alongside a committed and dedicated group of women. On the other hand, this will be my last Annual General Meeting and that feels a wee bit sad. I can only hope that my time here has in some small way contributed to the AWHL'S capacity to meet the needs of women whose lives have been impacted by violence.

A lot happens here at the AWHL: this year we have answered nearly 50,000 calls! Can you imagine if we were not there to answer the call? I don't want to think about it. Recently I was reviewing our literature and I came across a quote from one of the founding members who stated "as the police sergeant read the figures to me, the realization came to me in a dramatic way the purpose of this Helpline is to keep people alive." For this reason, more than any other, we must ensure that AWHL will always be able to answer the call.

We successfully operated the Senior Safety Line, answering a further 9,618 calls. The SSL provides specialized support and services to seniors across the province, reduces their isolation and assists them with determining their next steps.

After 20 years, we moved offices and are settled into our new home. We could not have done this without our fearless leader Huong Pham who made this all possible.

You may recall we launched our new logo at our 15th Annual Helpline Gala in November. We had one of our most successful gala's ever. Our outreach team participated in numerous local community events from Potato Festival in Alliston to Garlic Festival in Perth all to ensure that women and their families know how to reach us. Know that there is a free, confidential counsellor available to assist her towards a life free of violence.

We continue to explore offering support with different technology modalities to ensure we can respond to the ever-changing needs of women whose lives are impacted by violence.

As I stated earlier, our counsellors answered almost 50,000 calls. 24 hours a day 365 days a year and in over 200 languages.

It seems to me that a new conversation is happening, starting with #metoo and #enoughisenough, a new narrative is beginning and those of us who support women experiencing violence are a wee bit more energized as we continue the conversation that will positively effect the lives of women who are impacted by violence.

Thank you to the entire team at the AWHL. Without you we would not be able to support the women of Ontario in the best possible way. The complexity and range of the calls has increased, as we respond to calls from survivors of incest, childhood abuse, and ritual abuse.

To the women who call us each day, thank you for placing your trust in us, and for continuing to share your lives with us.

On behalf of the Board of Directors I extend our respect and appreciation of the entire staff team, our community supporters, donors and funders, whom all make this work possible. Thank you.



AWHL Statistics for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2019

















Breakdown by Relatives, Neighbours, Friends & Professionals

Type of Abuse Experienced by Our Callers


